ITEM #1

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARAGOULD, ARKANSAS: APPLICATION OF DONALD G. PURCELL AND JOHN E. PURCELL – PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE 1700-1900 BLOCKS OF HIGHWAY 49 NORTH

Motion made that the ordinance be offered by Councilmember Biggs; seconded by Councilmember Rowland.

Attorney Roger Colbert was present along with his clients, Donald G. Purcell and John E. Purcell. Mr. Colbert stated this property is located in the 1700-1900 block of Highway 49 North. This property contains 28.76 acres and is currently zoned C-3. The property owners are requesting this property be rezoned to R-3. This rezone was presented to the planning commission on November 7th. Five members were present and all five voted in favor of this rezone.

Mr. Colbert stated several adjoining property owners attended the planning commission meeting in opposition. All of the concerns were addressed in this ordinance including rezoning the North 250 feet R-2, prohibiting mobile homes on the property and no right of ingress or egress from Fairview Road.

Jerry Halsey with Halsey Thrasher Harpole Real Estate Group is marketing the property and was present to answer any questions the council may have. Mr. Halsey stated the property would be marketed for the development of multi-million dollar multi-family dwellings.

Councilmember Agee and Councilmember Biggs had questions concerning traffic issues in that area and the utilities that run thru the middle of the property.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARAGOULD, ARKANSAS: APPLICATION OF AMY GLENN, KEVIN EUBANKS, MARTHA KARAN SUMMITT AND SARAH WILHOIT – PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE 900-1200 BLOCKS OF HIGHWAY 49 NORTH

Mr. Colbert stated this property is located in the 900-1200 block of Highway 49 North. This property contains 17.56 acres and is currently zoned AG. The property owners are requesting this property be rezoned to C-3. This rezone was presented to the planning commission on November 7th. Five members were present and all five voted in favor of this rezone.

Mr. Colbert stated that he has talked with Paragould Airport Manager, Roger Slayton about the issues with this land being at the end of the runway. Mr. Colbert provided documentation to the council showing that Mr. Slayton has no issue with this property being rezoned. Mr. Colbert also stated that his clients are aware that they will still need FAA approval before this property can be developed.

Mayor Gaskill stated that he has requested State Aid Street money to overlay McDaniel Road and Oak Drive. This project is expected to cost approximately \$263,451.75. A city the size of Paragould is required to pay 10% up to \$250,000 and the balance over \$250,000. This project is expected to cost the city approximately \$38,451.75.

ITEM # 6

REPORT FROM VECTOR DISEASE CONTROL

A report provided by Vector Disease Control stated that for the month of September/October, 2019 VCDI has utilized six light traps placed in residential and recreational areas throughout the city. The traps collected an average of 20.3 mosquitos per trap night, for a total of 487 mosquitos. Three sites were inspected for larval mosquito breeding. VCDI applied 200 ounces of granular BTI to these sites. VCDI applied adulticide on 14 truck nights spraying a total of 378. miles (13408.90 acres) using a total of 117.7 gallons of adulticide. VCDI responded to six service request and adulticided all parks and any special events during the months of September and October.

Also, a year-end report was provided for 2019. The report stated that VCDI applied adulticide a total of 82 nights spraying a total of 2690.5 miler (98,470.10 acres) using a total of 752.3 gallons of adulticide. VCDI has utilized six light traps placed in residential and recreational areas throughout the city. The traps collected three species a nightly average of 31.2 mosquitos per trap night, for a total of 2,090 mosquitos. Five aerial sprays were performed with a total of 2019 gallons used on 40,766 acres.
